Summer schedule begins

Our summer worship schedule begins this Sunday with services at 8 and 10 a.m. Our popular Saturday service returns on June 5 at 5:15 p.m. Although the summer seems to be a time of relaxation, the busy pace will continue at Good Shepherd with Church Under the Bridge on May 30, the youth pilgrimage to Ireland in June and many other activities and events.

Mortgage burning Sunday at 10 a.m.

Yes, that is right! We will burn the mortgage paper signed in 2002 for \$4 million which accomplished Vision 2000 of major renovation to the church property. We rebuilt part of the Bloomfield Building, established major handicapped entrances to most of the building, created a children's chapel, connected the Bloomfield Building with the Burton Building eliminating the alleyway, created a new choir room and new office space plus new heating and cooling equipment that not only adequately handles the current facility but will accommodate the new parish hall when built.

Late this spring, through the generosity of our members, the last payment was made on the mortgage and we now have a "paid in full" mortgage paper that will be raised in smoke giving thanks for a debt free facility. We hope everyone will be present at the 10 a.m. service for this special occasion.

Our mission at the Church of the Good Shepherd is to worship God and proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ, to honor our Episcopal tradition, to care for one another within our parish family, and to reach out in loving service to our community and the world.

Pentecost celebration

All church members are invited to play a special part by wearing red when we celebrate Pentecost this Sunday, May 23, at 10 a.m. Children are asked to meet in the Undercroft at 9:30 a.m. that day to get red streamers and instructions. Children will join in the procession at the beginning of the worship service. During the Gospel procession, children will come into the center aisle and use their streamers to celebrate the Holy Spirit. Refreshments follow in the Undercroft.
